Additional comments regarding second job: Second jobs must NOT conflict with the primary job schedule! Work & Travel participants are not permitted to begin work before their Sponsor has approved any secondary employer. Working without authorization may jeopardize your Work & Travel program. A second job offer and instructions will be provided in your welcome letter. Your CHI program coordinator is always available to help you with this process.

When will work begin? After receiving a Social Security card & completion of E-Verify. Up to 2 weeks.

Arrival Instructions: Your official start date will be scheduled once you arrive at the employer. Start dates may vary several days from your DS date. Please be patient and allow the employer to integrate you into the schedule.

Is training required? Yes

Conditions of training: Training paid at the hourly rate. Students will be trained in several different positions. Training may take up to two weeks. Students may not receive full hours until training period is complete. No job, or hours at a job, can be 100% guaranteed. Regardless of what your work contract states, there is always a possibility that you will work more or less hours. Participants should expect to have less hours during the first two weeks of training. Some days will be slower than others. Do students need to purchase specific clothes or footwear? Yes

If so, details for clothing: You will be required to be in full uniform to start training. Participants must purchase black trousers, black jeans, or checked chef trousers, black, slip-resistant, close-toed shoes. There are many shops in Key West to purchase required pants.

Grooming: No visible piercings (including no tongue rings). Girls may wear one stud earring in each ear but nothing else. Any employee with long hair must have it up and off their shoulders. Men must be clean-shaven. Conservative hairstyle and hair color. Only clear nail polish is permitted; nails must be kept short and well-groomed. No visible tattoos. Culturally in the US, it is considered unsanitary not to shower every day.

Important points of job: MV/LS uses the E Verify system. You must first apply for your Social Security card before processing your paperwork. This may take 10 days to 2 weeks before being officially scheduled. MV/LS guarantees 32 hours per week, but will set schedules am or pm to allow for second jobs.

Additional position information: WHAT YOU SHOULD EXPECT AT WORK: To lift and carry 22kgs, manual dexterity, bend, stoop, twist, reach, and stand for long periods of time. Multi-task in a very fast-paced environment. Participants are in contact with sharp knives, boiling liquids, and hot pans. You will work with pork, clean, including washing heavy kitchen mats, breaking down boxes, and removing garbage. Kitchens will be hot. Support, encourage, respect colleagues. Provide courteous, friendly, efficient customer service. Be able to work in a team. AC Food Halls is located in a Casino, there is an indoor smoking section within the area. Students will be required to work on peak business days, Friday, Saturday, and Sundays. Cashiers: Basic math skills; must be familiar with U.S. currency prior to arriving. MUST STUDY/LEARN THE ATTACHED AMERICAN CURRENCY GUIDE.

US RESTAURANT CULTURE: Some days will be slower than others. It is common practice in the United States for employees of restaurants to be sent home early (cut) if business does not allow for a full staff.

MEDICAL ISSUES: If you travel to the U.S. knowing that you have a medical condition that would prevent you from working at your pre-arranged job, CHI will terminate your program. Please disclose any allergies (food, dust, or chemical) or pre-existing conditions that may affect your ability to fulfill your commitments at your pre-arranged job. If you have a sudden medical problem that prevents you from working at your pre-arranged job, you must get a note from a doctor in the U.S. before you take any action to leave your pre-arranged job. If the medical condition is serious or is not covered by your insurance, CHI may ask that you return to your home country, for your health and safety.

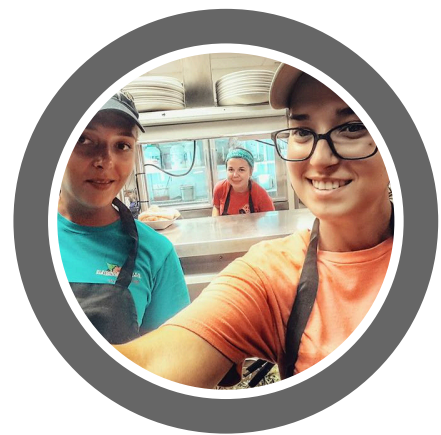
You will not start working on your DS Date, it will take 10 days to 2 weeks to start your job. Follow the steps listed here to insure there are no delays in your processing.



- 1  Make certain you download Whatsapp and join the IMCMV processing group.
- 2  Enter your flight in your CHI portal. wt.chinet.org Your coordinators need to plan for your arrival.
- 3  Reserve a hotel for your arrival night in Atlantic City.
- 4  Complete your SEVIS validation. wt.chinet.org You must do this as soon as you arrive to Atlantic City.
- 5  Once you have completed your SEVIS validation, contact your coordinator on Whatsapp to get clearance to go to the Social Security Office.
- 6  Find your permanent summer housing.
- 7  Begin to fill out your online application and Paycor. Your Program Coordinator can help you with this on the Whatsapp group.
- 8  You will receive an email from CHI that you are validated. You may go to the Social Security office and apply for your card once you receive this email NOT before. Social Security will issue you a receipt that you have applied. Please check to make certain your name and address are correct before leaving the office. This is the receipt you need to start your paperwork at IMCMV.

Bar Backs, Servers, Runners, Bussers – Must complete steps 9 and 10. Hosts, Cooks, and Retail may skip step 9.

- 9  **You may not do this step until the DS date listed on your Visa.** Apply for casino registration and fingerprinting. You will go to the Casino Control Commission @ Tennessee avenue and the Boardwalk. You will fill out an application, bring your passport, receipt from Social Security, your 1-94 form, DS form and a check or visa for \$95. They do not accept cash. Your Program Coordinator will help you with the process.
- 10  Take your Social Security receipt, I-94, DS Form, Passport, and (casino license, if applicable) to Margaritaville or Landshark and give it all to the manager. Don't forget anything or I promise you will be delayed further. Make certain your Paycor is complete and have the manager confirm completion.

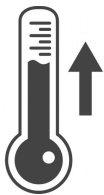

Adaptation is not always easy, working is hard, but it is important to remember that you are temporarily in the United States for a new learning experience.

The key to a successful program is to stay positive and be flexible.



Participants who accept the position, must be willing to work in hot kitchens, near grill and ovens.



Participants should have manual dexterity sufficient to chop, mix, blend, whip a variety of foods. Participants will come into contact with sharp knives.



Participants who accept the position, must be willing to remove trash.



Participants who accept the position, will come into contact with boiling liquids, hot oil and hot pans.



Participants who accept the position, must be willing to clean. Including bathrooms.



Participants who accept this position, need their Social Security to begin processing. Students should be prepared with enough money to cover expenses for one month.



Participants who accept the position, must be able to work with pork.



Participants who accept the position, must not have any food allergies.



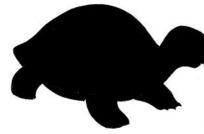
The concept of time plays a great role in American culture. Being late consistently makes you unreliable. Come to work as scheduled and on time. Good attendance ensures your hours.



No job, or hours at a job, can be 100% guaranteed. Regardless of what your work contract states, there is always a possibility that you will work more or less hours. Expect lower hours during the first two weeks of training.



Second jobs must be approved by CHI prior to starting. Your CHI coordinator will help you with this process. Your employer will provide you with set am or pm schedules to help you obtain a second job.



Some work days will be slower than others. It is common practice for employees to be sent home early if business does not allow for a full staff.



Participants should have the experience and knowledge necessary to deal with the potential dangers of life in an urban environment. Pick pockets operate in this area.



Open a bank account and get a debit card. Do not carry cash, valuables or your documents with you. Bring an alternative ID to carry. Keep your passport and documents stored safely at your housing.



Bicycle riders with helmets had an 85 percent reduction in their risk of head injury and an 88 percent reduction in their risk of brain injury. If you ride a bicycle in the US, wear a helmet.



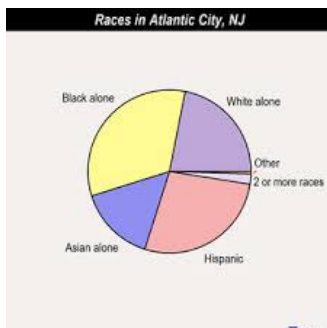
Participants should use common sense, stay with a partner or friend, especially at night. It is recommended participants let a friend know where they are.



You must arrange your own housing. We recommend you search for your housing prior to arrival. Be prepared with an arrival plan. Do not arrive late at night.



A security deposit protects landlords from the cost associated with: parties, loud noise, damage, dirt, trash, unpaid rent, or utility bills. Participants who leave housing before the end of their program will *NOT* see any portion of their security deposit returned. Your refund is conditional, CHI coordinators can not negotiate a return.



Participants should be aware the United States is a melting pot. You will come into contact with all kinds of people and ways of life. All ages, shapes and sizes, levels of wealth, backgrounds, religions, sexual preferences, and ethnicities.
